

Jesus is Elevating Your Expectations

John 11 (NASB95) Pastor Brian Kennedy

TEXT QUESTIONS TO PASTOR AS HE IS PREACHING TO: (909) 906-0272

Take it home point: Jesus is elevating your expectations.

- A. When You Expect One Thing, Jesus is Often Laying the Foundation to Elevate Your Expectations (vs.1-6).
 - 1. Mary and Martha sent a message informing Jesus that Lazarus was sick with the expectation that Jesus would come and heal him (they expected one thing).
 - 2. Jesus loved Mary, Martha, and Lazarus deeply, but He delayed two days and declared Lazarus' circumstances would bring glory to God (Jesus laid the foundation to elevate their expectations).
- B. Your Expectations Can Divert Your Focus Away From What Jesus is Doing (vs. 7-15).
 - 1. Jesus focused on the work, but the disciples focused on death threats (vs. 7-10).

Note: Perhaps they forgot Jesus demonstrated His power over the death threats, arrest warrants, and attempts to kill Him (John 5:15-18; 6:15; 7:30-32, 43-44; 8:20, 59; 10:31, 39, etc.).

2. Jesus delayed their journey to elevate their expectations, but they misunderstood the purpose for the delay (vs. 11-15).

Note: The disciples saw Jesus turn water into wine on the spot (2:1-11), and heal a royal official's son on the spot (2:4-53). Jesus healed the man who was sick 38 years (5:1-9), fed 5,000 plus people (6:1-14), and healed the man born blind, all on the spot (9:1-41). However, this time, Jesus delayed His response to a request for healing.

- 3. Jesus' delay did not mean denial, or death, but an opportunity to elevate believer's expectations (vs. 15-16).
- C. Jesus Elevates Your Expectations to a New Normal (vs. 17-44).
 - 1. Although Martha confessed her belief in Jesus as The Messiah, and in His healing power, she was disappointed Jesus did not prevent her brother's death. Hence, Jesus elevated Martha's expectation to a new normal by revealing Himself as the source for raising the dead, receiving eternal life, and preventing eternal death (vs. 17-28).
 - 2. With a crowd accompanying her, Jesus used compassion to elevate Mary expectations beyond disappointment to a new normal (vs. 29-37).
 - 3. Jesus, Who is the source for raising from people from the dead, raised Lazarus from the dead to elevate everyone's expectations to a new normal (vs. 38-46).

Personal Challenge: With Jesus always working in your life, embrace Jesus elevating your expectations to a new normal (stop doubting, complaining, quitting, holding grudges, being arrogant, making excuses, etc. and embrace Jesus elevating your expectations).

Personal Prayer: Dear Lord, thank You for not leaving me in the limitations of my normal expectations. Your work in my life helps me understand when I expect one thing You can be laying the foundation to elevate my expectations. Your work in my life helps me understand how my focus can be diverted away from what You are doing. Your work in my life helps elevate my expectations to a new normal. Lord, work in me, through me, around me, and on my behalf so my expectations of You elevate to a new normal for Your glory. I live to love and serve You. Amen.
