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I Will Do More in 2024 Il Cor. 5:17-20 (NASB95)

A personal reflection on serving at a 101-year-old church points me to use divine mathematics. Your service in Christ + my service in Christ = thriving Great Commission Ministry. My commitment to service becomes more personal because I am intricately connected to your commitment to serve as members of the body of Christ. Hence, when each of us declares: "in Christ, I will do more in 2024," we are saying Mt. Zion will do more. We are committing ourselves to a movement of God's people thriving in Great Commission ministry.

As you review this report, rejoice as God combined our individual commitments to bring light to the community and beyond through evangelism, discipleship, and faithful service. For instance, in 2023, we baptized fifty-four people. The Sunday youth, children, and nursery worship services have more than doubled. We planted City Connect Church in Fontana with Pastor Wallace and several members. We celebrated their first year on March 3, 2024. In the last five years, Mt. Zion placed Pastors Aikens and Wallace, plus several members at two church plants. We also planted Impacto Church with the Gutierrez Family. Pastor Orontes is pastoring from home. Mt. Zion also sent the Laceys and the Jacksons out for two church revitalizations (Mt. Zion members are also assisting with the Laceys). Praise Jesus! At the end of 2023, all weekly Bible studies were hybrid, and the Monday night "hour of power" on-line prayer meeting averaged 125 prayer warriors. We hired a part-time staff member to coordinate our FOCAS (Fellowship of Christian Adult Singles), and Couples ministries, so all their efforts are connected. The Homeless to Housed (H2H) ministry also kicked off in 2023.

In 2023, God used the generous giving of Mt. Zion members and friends to reach our first million-dollar milestone in savings for the capital campaign. We also outsourced our extensive accounting work to Water's Edge to ensure we remain compliant with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. This year we are pleased to present our first set of financial statements from Water's Edge. Our Helping Hands ministry continues to thrive with God using our seasoned seniors at the helm. Each Saturday and Sunday, our music, and dance ministries inspire us to experience the presence and power of God in our worship.

In 2023, several of our loved ones went to heaven, including two staff members (Cynthia Beatty and Charles Durley). In our grieving, God keeps giving us renewed strength to mount up with wings like an eagle, run and not be weary, and walk and not faint (Isaiah 40:31).

As you review the 2023 report, worship God for what He has done, what He is doing, and what He is going to do. As you review our 2024 goals, pray for God to speak to you regarding what you will do as a member of the body of Christ. In Christ, what is the more God wants you to do in 2024? Individually, let us do the more God wants from each of us, and together let us anticipate God using our service to Christ to do more than we can ask or think.

Daniel Fast 1/4 thru 1/13: We started the new year with our churchwide annual 10-day Daniel fast to spend more time in prayer and seek God's guidance.

City Connect Church: City Connect, a Mt. Zion church plant led by Pastor Brian E. Wallace, was established in North Fontana.

Black History: The Black History Program theme, "Lest We Forget", reminded us to learn from our past to build the future.

Parents' Night Out: In conjunction with the Couples' Valentines Dinner, the Children's Ministry hosted Parents' Night Out for 21 children.

Children's Choir: The Children's Choir (comprised of 20 members) returned and ministers every 4th Sunday. This choir encourages multi-generational participation during services. The Mass Choir returned on the First Sunday.

Glorious Praise Dance Conference: Dancers were introduced to scriptures that promote praising in dance. Attendees enjoyed learning about various arts and African drums.

Good Friday Service: To celebrate the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus, we explored His 7 last saying on the cross found in the four gospels with a multiethnic group of preachers helping us reflect on the extent of God's love.

Resurrection (Easter) Sunday: Held at the Ontario Town Square, our services on Resurrection Sunday reached more than 2,800 attendees, both online and in-person





Fitness Ministry: The Gospel Line Dance class continued to grow. Starting with 8 members, the class averaged 20 attendees each week.

2023 African Missions Tour: Returning from a visit to Uganda, the team led a 3-day Bible Study and Leadership training while feeding 227 attendees.

Church Anniversary: Our 101st anniversary celebration included a graduation ceremony with 41 participants from preschool thru college.

Night of Prayer: A hybrid event, the mid-year Night of Prayer brought ministry leaders together to celebrate God's kindness and thank Him for our anticipated blessings.

Tchula Missions Trip: Returning to the South for the first time since the pandemic with 36 team members, of which 19 were youth we ministered to over 164 people and 19 children put their faith in Jesus.

Mental Health Ministry: hosted "In Our Own Voice" partnering with NAMI, a 90 min. presentation with lived experiences of those with mental health conditions.

Annual Picnic: Our "Zion in the Park" picnic included a cook-off, a classic car show, jumpers, and games for the entire family. We enjoyed food and fun in the sun.

Evangelism Ministry: The Evangelism team continued to go out each Saturday morning sharing the Word and bringing people closer to Christ.

Healing Conversations on Race: A panel led a discussion centered on "What does God/Bible say about race?" Participants appreciated a safe space to share personal experiences.

Men's Retreat: The Kingdom Retreat allowed men to deepen their relationships with God as well one another. The 54 attendees focused on understanding their role as brothers, husbands, fathers, and friends.

Next Gen Anniversary: Celebrating its first anniversary, the Next Gen service was an opportunity for youth and young adult to be baptized. Brother D'Ante Smith preached his first sermon and became a licensed minister.

Harvest Festival: In its 16th year, the Harvest Festival attracted more than 1,000

attendees, 30 of whom accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior.

Helping Hands Holiday Boxes: Helping Hands volunteers gave 250 food boxes feeding 1050 people. The Ministry also offers Thursday Bible Study each week.

Thanksgiving Day Service: After hearing a great word from our own Brother Ramy Baheeg, Mt. Zion ordained him as a licensed minister on Thanksgiving.

Christmas Concert: Gospel Artists, Brother Brent Jones and the Best Life Choir, blessed our RISE Service with a Christmas Concert.

Angel Tree: Mt. Zion in partnership with Prison Fellowship, the Mareisha Smiles Foundation showed the love of Christ to 95 Children of inmates. Three Angel Tree recipients (Teliah & Telani Brooks , Savannah Santiago) helped to host the event.



To provide a stimulating program that will ensure parents that their child is receiving quality care, which will help them grow spiritually, socially, intellectually, physically, and emotionally.


To strengthen and support families by providing an opportunity for them to enhance their parenting skills through parent conferences, meetings and every day interactions with teachers and other parents.
