

After over sixteen years of planning and paying down the land loan (almost exclusively through the sacrificial support of Mt. Zion members and friends), **it's almost time to break ground.**

A few years from now, the City of Ontario will begin building the west side of the Ontario Ranch – a master planned community designed for over 100,000 new residents. The site of **the new Mt. Zion campus** is positioned on prime property in the midst of this exciting new development.

On the pages of this booklet, you will learn more about our vision for **a God-sized effort that expands on our current kingdom impact** and how you can join us in this effort. We believe our campaign motto: GOD CAN DO IT! We believe God will use you to do His work.

OUR GOD-SIZED *Plan*

2001

Establish a building fund and receive congregation support of a feasibility study that supports the purchase of vacant land



2003

Close escrow on 20 acres of land on the southeast corner of Grove and Chino Avenue in the City of Ontario



2021

Pay off \$2.4 million land loan and burn the land mortgage



2022

Raise \$5 million by September 2022, our 100th church anniversary celebration to prepare to break ground

2028

Begin phase three of construction on the Sanctuary, Outdoor Courtyard, Parking Structure, Restaurant and Small Business Center



2025

Begin phase two of construction on the Youth Center, and Administrative Building, Pre-School, Senior Housing Facility and Athletic Field



2023

Break ground and begin phase one of construction with infrastructure, the Education Center and the Mt. Zion Center

BUILDING FOR *People*

BUILDING FOR *Worship*

The **sanctuary** will be an architectural marvel. There will be a beautiful courtyard main entrance that leads to the **4,000-seat auditorium** with a large lobby, small bookstore, internet-ready prayer room to seat 100, and a **small chapel** that can seat 100 for smaller events. There will be a stage area for major productions and space for 200 choir members. An elevator will provide access to the upstairs seating and raised baptismal area.

Just outside the sanctuary will be a **courtyard** with a park-like environment and a second baptismal pool with the capacity to host outdoor events. Large screens will stream services live. In the courtyard, Mt. Zion family and friends will enjoy ongoing fellowship after services.

BUILDING FOR *Learning*

Adjacent to the sanctuary will be an **educational center** with 40 smart classrooms designed for up to 30 students each. The classrooms will be used for Bible studies, the Mt. Zion School, church related educational programming and non-church related meeting rooms. Central to this area will be ten administrative offices, a reception area, and an open area for volunteers to work on large projects. The education center will also house a library and state-of-the-art computer lab.

Some classrooms will be designed with wall partitions to allow conversion into large meeting rooms that can hold up to 150 participants. The education center will have several break areas, a small banquet facility, and a small full-service kitchen area for smaller events. Mt. Zion will consider a charter school to occupy a part of this building, and partner with a university for a satellite campus.

BUILDING FOR *Community*

The **Mt. Zion Center** will be a two-story multi-event building with a family life center, a children's center, a sit-down restaurant, banquet facilities, the Mt. Zion Snack Shack, and executive suites.

On the first floor will be the **family life center**, which will include a full basketball court with stadium seating, a karate dojo, and a recreation area for fitness classes. The center will also have a full-service indoor gym with exercise equipment, a two-lane indoor track, showers and dressing rooms, a few conference-style meeting rooms, a childcare facility for 30 children, and a small store for purchasing healthy food items and fitness products.

In a fully secured section on the first floor will be the **children's ministry center** with a total of 20 classrooms, a small kitchen, and a convertible meeting area with a large stage, permanent puppet show stage, and room for up to 600 children. Next to the children's section, a nursery will accommodate 100 infants and toddlers.

The first floor will also house the **Mt. Zion Snack Shack**, a home-grown business (potentially even a drive-thru) where customers can drop by early in the morning, during the day, or fellowship after evening gatherings.

The second floor will have a **dine-in restaurant** with a commercial kitchen. This restaurant could supply the catering services needed to accommodate conferences. This floor will also house **banquet facilities** to host up to 1,000 guests.

The second floor will also have 20 **executive suites and boardrooms**, breakrooms, and an administrative support area that community businesses can rent.

>> **How important is it for our community to be reached through our church?**

BUILDING FOR *Generations*

Next to the Mt. Zion Center will be the **youth center** which will have a large meeting room to seat 500 youth. A recreation area will have a full basketball court, a game area for 150 kids, standing room for 200 kids, and three counseling rooms.

Upstairs in this building will be ten breakout rooms that can seat up to 35 youth each. The architectural design of this building will allow the ability to look upstairs from the bottom floor. The second floor will also have an internet-ready study hall with 15 computer stations, small library with lounge areas, soundproof music room and a video room.

Just east of the sanctuary, the **Mt. Zion Pre-School** will have a separate building with the capacity to serve 400 children from ages two to five.

>> **How will we prepare the next generation without investing in them today?**

BUILDING FOR *Service*

A two-story section just east of the sanctuary will include the **administrative offices** for church staff, Mt. Zion Community Development Corporation staff, and volunteers.

On the first floor there will be a small business center, multi-media center, computer room, office supply store, bookstore, lobby area, security office with room for camera monitoring, a conference room to seat 50 people and an open space work area for large work projects.

On the second floor, there will be two conference style meeting rooms to seat ten people and 35 people respectively, 30 spacious staff offices and two executive suites. Additionally there will be two large common work areas for volunteers, a large room for the computer technician, a lounge/snack room for staff, and a small reference library.

BUILDING FOR *Recreation & Living*

On the far east corner of the campus, there will be a **two-story senior living facility** with 60 units of senior housing available to members of the church and community.

Nearby this area will be the **athletic fields** which will include a track-and-field training area, two tennis courts, four half courts for basketball, swimming pool and pool house for official swim meets, two racquet/handball courts, a soccer field, and a baseball training facility. Around the fields, shade coverings, park benches, and a walking area will create a park-like environment.

Along the perimeter of the parking structure will be a **full service restaurant** with WiFi connectivity. There will also be a small café area with an outside sitting area. Jumbo screens will be positioned inside and outside the café for viewing sports events and worship services.


The **small business center** will also have a dry cleaners, bank or Mt. Zion Credit Union, travel agency, barbershop, hair salon, and office space for three to five other small businesses. We are also open to housing a police sub-station.
